While not as consistent as in previous games Na Gaeil were always in control in this tie and were two points up after ten minutes of play courtesy of points from Dara Devine and James O'Connor . In the eight minute the St. Pat's goalie batted a ball down onto the path of the in rushing Diarmaid Herlihy and he struck it low into the opposition's net to give them a five point lead. Fergal O'Brien opened the scoring for the Blennerville side with a point on eleven minutes which was cancelled out almost immediately by a Dara Devine pointed free.
