**Súil Siar** Div. 4 Final 2016: At the end of this campaign both Na Gaeil and Fossa had finished level on points at the top of the table so a play off was required at Paddy Burke Park, Milltown on Sunday, November 14<sup>th</sup> 2016 to decide who would be promoted as champions. The opening skirmishes were pretty even and at the end of the first quarter the sides were level at 0-03 each. Then Na Gaeil seemed to get a foothold on the game and reeled off four points in a five minute spell, two coming from the boot of Ian McCarthy, to put themselves in a strong position after 21 minutes. Fossa, who had looked somewhat lethargic up to this point, suddenly found a gear. Midfielder Fintan Coffey lofted over a great point in the 27<sup>th</sup> minute and then wing forward Paudie Clifford leveled the game with a goal two minutes later. The same player pointed in the 27<sup>th</sup> minute and crashed home his second goal two minutes into added time to give Fossa an unlikely four point advantage at the interval (2-05 to 0-07).

They patiently worked their way back into the game and with Darragh Carmody and Diarmaid Herlihy frequently finding the target they were back in front in the 41<sup>st</sup> minute. A pointed free from Tadhg O'Shea put Fossa back on level terms going into the final quarter but it was the Tralee side that pushed on as they held Fossa scoreless from play for the entire second half. Substitute Dylan Seymour landed two great points in the closing minutes to copper fasten victory for Na Gaeil and cap a fine season for the Killeen side.
