## Na Gaeil Notes Monday June 14<sup>th</sup> 2021

Seniors Na Gaeil hosted Ballydonoghue in Round 1 of the Division 2 County League in a warm and sunny Killeen on Sunday afternoon. Ballydonoghue got off to the better start with Jack Foley pointing inside the first minute, followed by pointed frees from Jack Behan and Paul Kennelly to put them 3 ahead after 10 minutes. Andrew and Fergal Barry were making good runs into Ballydonoghue territory. Na Gaeil's Jack Sheehan had a point blank shot saved by Darragh O'Shea in the Ballydonoghue goals before Dara Devine pointed a free for the home side to open their account after 11 minutes of play. Paul Kennelly pointed another free after 13 minutes. Jack Sheehan made no mistake with his 2<sup>nd</sup> attempt on goal when he fired home from close range in the 19<sup>th</sup> minute to level the game at 1-01 to 0-04. Andrew Barrw slotted over a great point in the 26<sup>th</sup> minute after an incisive run through the middle but this was cancelled out by a point from Ballydonoghue's Kevin O'Donnell. Ian McCarthy pointed a free for Na Gaeil on 30 minutes followed by a point from Paul Kennelly for the North Kerry side on 34 minutes to leave matters all square at the interval. It was tit for tat at this stage with nothing separating the sides. That man again Paul Kennelly pointed two more frees for Ballydonoghue. But Darragh Carmody was equally as accurate for the home side, kicking the next three scores for Na Gaeil to leave them one ahead with three minutes of normal time left to play. Paul Kennelly pointed the next two frees for Ballydonoghue to put them one ahead once more. Darragh Carmody leveled matters with a pointed free on thirty minutes but Jack Foley put Ballydonoghue ahead in the 34<sup>th</sup> minute. Na Gaeil had one last attack and after some good support play Eoin O'Neill finished a great move to fire over from 30 metres out to earn a well deserved draw which both teams were happy with in the end. Na Gaeil's Enda O'Connor had a marvelous game at corner back with Jack Sheehan very influential up front. Jack Foley and Brian O'Seanacháin were impressive for Ballydonoghue.
