Súil Siar Munster Novice Football Final, Sunday December 12th 2010: Na Gaeil travelled to Knockaderry in Limerick on Sunday last to take on Granagh/Ballingarry in the Munster Novice Football Final. Despite their net being breached three times Na Gaeil managed to claim the title and become the

fourth Kerry side in a row to do so following a strange 60 minutes in Knockaderry outside Newcastlewest. One would normally take one's hat off to a defence that only concedes one point in the entire courrse of a game but sloppy defending on three occasions saw the Tralee side allow Granagh/Ballingarry back into a contest that the Limerick side actually led by 2-01 to 0-05 at half time. Only for a Trojan performance from midfielder, David Culloty and a lively half forward line of Ian McCarthy, Michael Griffin and Eamon O'Neill, Na Gaeil might very well have been left licking their wounds last Sunday. While Na Gaeil outscored their opponents eleven scores to four overall they were guilty of letting the Limerick side off the hook at various stages, not converting good scoring opportunities and losing possession at critical stages. They led three points to no score after 10 minutes thanks to points from Diarmaid Herlihy, Michael Griffin and Declan Doody, but disaster struck in the 13th minute when a sideline ball caused havoc in the Na Gaeil defence and despite Bobby Houlihan's first tilt being blocked down, the rebound came to Pat Carroll who side footed the ball past Adrian Quirke and into the net. Two Eamon O'Neill points regained the initiative for the Tralee side and while the game was ebbing and flowing at both ends the Na Gaeil defence was caught out by a high ball when Marcus Moore picked out Niall Cahill and he powered past Quirke in the Na Gaeil goal in the 22nd minute. Granagh/Ballingarry's full forward Eoin Kennedy scored their one and only point of the game three minutes later as Na Gaeil went in at half time with plenty to think about. The Tralee side emerged with far better purpose in the 2nd half, David Culloty really getting a grip on the game at midfield while Robert Murphy foraged well in defence. Two early points from Paul Daly leveled the scores up. While the Limerick side's energy and determination was still very evident their scoring touch almost evaporated in the 2nd period. Culloty put Na Gaeil back in front with a point in the 42nd minute and the Tralee side's supporters breathed a little easier shortly afterwards when a brilliant burst by Michael Griffin at the Granagh defence saw him work the ball through to Diarmaid Herlihy who passed to Seamie O'Neill for a vital goal that stretched Na Gaeil's advantage to four at 1-08 to 2-01 with 15 minutes left. Points in the 46th and 53rd minute from Griffin and Culloty brought the lead to six as the Limerick side's lack of scoring power started to see the game slip away from them. They kept Na Gaeil on their toes though going into stoppage time as substitute Seamus McDonnell managed to reduce the margin to three with their third goal. But two late wide were as good as points for Na Gaeil as they hung on for victory in the finish. Of the four victorious Kerry sides (the others being Cromane, Tousist, and Churchill) Na Gaeil certainly had the toughest of all in this competition last Sunday.
