Súil Siar St. Brendan's Board District Championship Final, Sunday, December 8th 2021: Newly promoted Na Gaeil were deservingly crowned St. Brendan's District Board Champions on Sunday last at Austin Stack Park, against a weary looking Ardfert side in what turned out to be an excellent and competitive encounter. Na Gaeil made a slow enough start and Ardfert despite all their recent exertions, looked the better side in the first quarter as they led 0-03 to 0-02, with Damien Wallace kicking 0-02 for Ardfert and Darren Dineen surging forward from centre back to score a beauty. Na Gaeil did not trouble the score board until the 14th minute when Darragh Carmody split the post with a fine left footed effort and then guickly pointed a free. Ardfert had 10 of their Munster winning team including Jerry Wallace who was a 2nd half sub in that game but Na Gaeil looked fresher. Na Gaeil were on top at midfield where Michael Griffin and the very impressive Jack Barry excelled with Barry breaking through in the 17th minute and setting up Jamie Lowham for a goal from close range. Damien Wallace responded twice to points from Darragh Carmody and the excellent Kieran O'Donovan that left the score at 1-05 to 0-05. It was very good fare in heavy underfoot conditions and heavy showers. Na Gaeil made their move in the final five minutes of the half with Jamie Lowham kicking a point and then running on to a Barry ball over the top and rifling a ferocious shot from 20 metres that flew into the Ardfert net past a helpless Darren Delaney. When Seamie O'Neill added a guick point, the lead was eight (2-07 to 0-05) but somehow you knew that Ardfert were going to respond. It came swiftly. A counter-attack produced a goal when Shane Griffin's effort was blocked and Nicky O'Sullivan forced the ball over the line. A Damien Wallace point brought an entertaining half to a close with Na Gaeil leading 2-07 to 1-06 but they had to face the elements in the 2nd period. The expected Ardfert fight back never materialised in the 2nd half. They tried hard but a certain weariness seemed to take hold. Na Gaeil grew in confidence with their full backline particularly Paul Daly and Kieran Dineen playing well. Jack Barry and David Culloty provided their attack with decent ball. Darragh Carmody kicked 0-04(0-03frees) in the 2nd half. Damien and Darren Wallace added two apiece for Ardfert as the game fizzled out to its final conclusion. So Na Gaeil who join Ardfert in Division 3 next season, deservedly took the St. Brendan's Board Championship. Man of the match was Paul Daly. His classy distribution kept Na Gaeil on the front foot.
