Saturday November 19th 2010: Munster Novice Semi-Final Na Súil Siar Gaeil V Kilbrin of Cork. The Kerryman headline read: Late flourish against Kilbrin sees Na Gaeil qualify for Munster Novice Final: Na Gaeil pulled away from Kilbrin during the closing 15 minutes in a highly entertaining Munster Novice semi-final hosted at Knockaderry on Saturday. When it mattered, the Tralee based side operated with a pace and direction that Kilbrin failed to match. Ultimately, the winning of the game was Na Gaeil's ability to find scores easier. With the sides deadlocked at the three quarter stage, gaps began to appear in a stretched Kilbrin defence and Na Gaeil took advantage on shooting six points without reply. There was no questioning Kilbrin's commitment to the cause yet after a cracking encounter, they had to yield to the more attractive verve in Na Gaeil's play. Kilbrin had appeared the sharper of the two sides early, Daniel O'Sullivan on target with back to back points. Na Gaeil had wasted some early possession yet they availed of good fortune on eight minutes. Eamon O'Neill's centre failed to be cleared and in nipped O'Neill's brother Seamie to clinically dispatch to the net. Kilbrin recovered from the setback, creating an impact from the positive play of Paudie O'Callaghan, William Egan, Jeffrey O'Callaghan and O'Sullivan. And a slick ground move knitted together neat deft touches on Jeffrey O'Callaghan, O'Sullivan and Thomas O'Reilly setting in motion Tony Nash to slide the ball home. Kilbrin might have added a second goal only for wing back Owen Sheahan to blast over the crossbar from close range. However, danger man O'Sullivan steered over excellent points to push Kilbrin into a commanding position. Though shooting eight wides in the opening half, Na Gaeil hauled themselves back into contention and a productive spell garnered well taken points to Mike Griffin and Diarmuid Herlihy that secured a stalemate 1-4 each at the short whistle. The Kerry side charged out of the blocks for the resumption, the O'Neills, Eamon and Seamie on target with points.

Though Kilbrin lost two players to injury, they remained firmly in the hunt from back to back points to O'Sullivan to tie matters 1-06 apiece by the three quarter stage. Na Gaeil picked up the baton, injecting real pace and no little power to their game from the pursuits of David Ross, Eoin O'Neill, Colm Lyons and David Culloty. And when it mattered, the Na Gaeil attack offered a distinct cutting edge through the grafting play of Eamon O'Neill and Mike Griffin. O'Neill's accuracy from the dead ball surfaced on converting two long range frees and a '45'. Kilbrin's challenge was blown, Na Gaeil finishing on the ascendency, Griffin and Seamie O'Neill pointing to put the stamp of approval on matters.
