A rain soaked pitch and a strong breeze made playing conditions tough but both teams put in a great effort to deliver a

thriller to the on looking supporters. The strong breeze favoured Na Gaeil in the first half with Dara Devine pointing from a free and a long kick by Segun Duyaile, hopping over the goalies head. Ardfert looked strong in attack and put some good moves together to secure their first point after six minutes. Diarmuid O'Connor proved hard to mark and covered a lot of ground in search of play.
