March 26th 2010: Na Gaeil 1:14 Knocknagoshel-Brosna 1:13. Our Súil Siar minors got back to winning way, at Knocknagoshel on Saturday, with a narrow victory over the home side. Playing against a strong breeze in the first half it was the scoring burst of Darren McCarthy just before half time, when he scored 1-1 in a devastating 3 minute spell, that brought us back into the game and allowed us go in just 1-6 to 1-4 down at the break. The expected wind assisted overhaul of that lead in the second half failed to materialise as the sturdy North Kerry outfit fought tooth and nail to prevent an easy victory. Inspired by James Walsh they cut swathes through a lighter visiting team and scored 7 points against the wind in that second half, getting their final point in the 33rd minute. Na Gaeil, though struggling in many positions, refused to give up the game. Powered by Ian McCarthy at midfield, who's personal tally of 8 points from play and frees speaks volumes for his performance, the team drove forward at every opportunity. Some inspired saves from the home team's goalkeeper, especially two pile drivers from a much more involved Lorcan Seymour, kept Knock in the game. At the other end Barry O'Connor produced a superb full length diving save to turn a certain goal around the post, and aided by the resolute defence of Jack Barry and Ross Culloty, Na Gaeil performed solidly in the face of the Knock attacks, but still gave up far too many opportunities. Young Michael Maher was the man of the day for Na Gaeil and the catalyst for much of our play, as he won possession time and time again in the air, from breaking ball, and from the adoption of good supporting positions. He stroked over a beautiful point to put us ahead for the first time in the 20th minute. Main beneficiaries of the play of McCarty and Maher in the forward division were Sean Lyons who notched three points from play and David Leahy, operating at full forward, who held his position well, won or broke ball back to the forwards and never gave up. Jonathan Lee and Eoin Daly covered acres of ground on the wings and with improved passing and ball control will become very effective in the remaining games. The win almost guarantees us a Semi Final berth in the County League, Division 3B. Between injuries, suspension and ill health we had only 15 players on duty in Knocknagoshel.
