Seniors Na Gaeil played Ballydonoghue in the quarter final of the Intermediate Championship in Killeen on Sunday. Conditions were ideal and the pitch was in good shape despite the recent rain. Stefan Okunbor made a welcome return to the Na Gaeil starting fifteen after spending two years in Australia with Geelong Cats. Diarmuid O'Connor opened the scoring for Na Gaeil after 3 minutes of play with a fine point from 30 metres out on the right wing. Both sides had a number of wides but on 9 minutes a Paul Kennelly free dropped short into the Na Gaeil square. The defence failed to deal with it and it broke out to Jack Kennelly. He kicked it low along the ground into the right hand corner of the Na Gaeil net, giving goalkeeper Devon Burns no chance. Then on the quarter hour mark Diarmuid O'Connor made good ground down the right wing and in along the end line. He passed the ball across to the in rushing Dan Goggin and he finished it left footed to the Ballydonoghue net. Darragh Carmody followed up with a point on 18 minutes to leave the home side ahead at the water break on a scoreline of 1-02 to 1-0. Unfortunately Stefan Okunbor cried off with an injury shortly after the re-start and he was replaced by Kieran O'Donovan. Na Gaeil played their best football in the 2nd quarter and totally dominated in all sectors. They scored the next four points on the trot through Jack Barry, Diarmuid O'Connor, Dan Goggin and Darragh Carmody. Half time score: Na Gaeil: 1-06; Ballydonoghue: 1-0.

Na Gaeil were well on top in this half also but found it difficult to turn possession into scores. Devon Burns was wide from a 45 metre free and Andrew Barry blasted wide after a great run through the middle of the Ballydonoghue defence. Jack Kennelly pointed for the North Kerry side after 5 minutes play. But the impressive Diarmuid O'Connor pointed for Na Gaeil 2 minutes later. Paul Kennelly scored for Ballydonoghue at the other end before the referee blew for the second water break. Na Gaeil were five points ahead at this stage on a scoreline of 1-07 to 1-02. Ballydonoghue had a player red carded with 17 minutes gone in the half which didn't help their cause but they battled right to the end. Diarmuid O'Connor slotted over his fourth point of the afternoon with five minutes of normal time left. But Ballydonoghue never gave up and scored the next two points through Jim Cremin and Paul Kennelly. Diarmuid O'Connor had the final say scoring a good point five minutes into added time to increase his tally to five for the

afternoon. Final score: Na Gaeil: 1-09; Ballydonoghue: 1-04. While it wasn't a game for the purists, a win is a win and Na Gaeil were always on top in this encounter. They now look forward to a semi final clash with Castleisland Desmonds on Saturday next, October 16th at 7pm in Austin Stack Park. We wish them, the best of luck.
