Na Gaeil Notes Monday September 21st 2020

Na Gaeil played An Ghaeltacht in the quarter final of the Intermediate Seniors Football Championship in Austin Stack Park on Saturday evening in what were perfect conditions for football. Notable absentees were county footballers Jack Barry and Brian O Beaglaoigh both out through injury and Dan Goggin of Na Gaeil who was involved with Causeway in the County hurling final. An Ghaeltacht were first out of the blocks with a well taken point from their number 13 Seamus Ó Muircheartaigh after a minute of play. Diarmuid O'Connor responded for Na Gaeil when he sent one over with his left in the third minute. Na Gaeil's Dara Devine could have gone for goal but opted to fist it over the bar and it came off the upright and went wide in the fifth minute. In the ninth minute Ryan O'Neill sent a ball across An Ghaeltacht's square to Jamie Lowham but over cooked the pass and the ball was cleared. Two goal scoring chances missed by Na Gaeil. Eoin O'Neill pointed for Na Gaeil in the 10th minute after a good run from the half forward line to put them two ahead. Nearing the end of the first quarter Padraig Og O Sé made a surging run forward and off loaded to Tomás Ó Sé who sent a rocket to the back of the Na Gaeil net. But Na Gaeil responded immediately. Andrew Barry gathered from the kick out and went on one of his trade mark solo runs into An Ghaeltacht territory. He gave a peach of a pass to the unmarked Tomás O hAiniféin who had cleverly slipped inside the An Ghaeltacht defence and he cooly slotted the ball low to the right of Tomás Mac an tSaoir into the An Ghaeltacht net. It was no more than O hAiniféin deserved for the huge work rate he was putting in. Na Gaeil were really on top at this stage and were winning all the breaks around the middle. Darragh Carmody slotted over a free followed by a point from Dara Devine. At the other end a shot by An Ghaeltacht came off the post and was cleared. Dan O'Connor pointed to put them four ahead. But An Ghaeltacht responded with a point from Tomás Ó Sé and a pointed free from Eanna Ó Conchúir. On 30 minutes Andrew Barry who was a thorn in the An Ghaeltacht side was hauled down by Eanna O Conchúir and he was sin binned for ten minutes. Darragh Carmody duly obliged with the resultant free. Eoin O'Neill scored his second point for Na Gaeil followed by a point by P.J. Mac Láimh for An Ghaeltacht. With 34 minutes gone Na Gaeil worked the ball up the field. Full back Niall O'Mahony found himself in acres of space and carried the ball to the edge of the An Ghaeltacht square. He unleashed a rasper of a shot which came off the crossbar. It bounced upwards into the path of Jamie Lowham and he punched it to the net. Seamus O Muircheartaigh pointed a free for An Ghaeltacht to leave the score at the interval: Na Gaeil: 2-07; An Ghaeltacht: 1-05.

Na Gaeil got the perfect start to the 2nd half with a pointed free from Darragh Carmody and a good point from play from substitute Darragh Reen. But five minutes in Eanna Ó Conchúir rattled the back of the Na Gaeil net after he was put through by the marauding Pádraig Óg Ó Sé. They followed up with two further points from Ruaidhraí Ó Beaglaoigh, one from a free and one from play

to bring it back to a two point game. It was end to end stuff at this stage with both sides trying to stamp their authority on the game. Darragh Carmody settled the Na Gaeil nerves in the 8th minute of the half with his fourth pointed free of the evening. The next score did not come until the 49th minute when Na Gaeil corner back Damien Bourke made a great run forward and slotted over to make it a four point game once again. An Ghaeltacht knew they had to respond. Ruaidhraí Ó Beaglaoigh pointed with ten minutes left. Éanna Ó Concúir pointed a free to make it a two point game nearing full time. There were to be four minutes of injury time played. Ruaidhraí Ó Beaglaoigh pointed another free in the 66th minute to reduce the margin to the minimum with injury time up. Disaster nearly struck when Na Gaeil keeper Devon Burns fluffed the kick out, the only mistake he made all day. It was gathered by Tomás Ó Sé who twisted and turned trying to shoot for goal but he was surrounded by a host of Na Gaeil defenders and was eventually whistled for over carrying. Na Gaeil took the free and the referee blew full time much to the delight of the Na Gaeil team and supporters. It was a terrific display by Na Gaeil. They stuck to their task from start to finish and thoroughly deserved their victory in the end. Well done to Jerome Stack and his management team for a job well done.
