Senior Co. Championship: Last Friday night was another milestone in our club's history as we took our place in the Senior County Championship for the very first time. Our opponents were our neighbours, the defending champions, Austin Stacks. Na Gaeil started brightly and had the majority of the early possession. However, our first 2 efforts went wide. It was to be our only score from play in the match. Straightaway Austin Stack burst downfield where a great run and point by their midfielder Michael O'Donnell saw them take the lead again. Soon afterwards a goal-bound shot by Dan Goggin was deflected out for a 45 but we failed to capitalise. Stacks upped their game and added 2 points in quick succession to lead by 3 after just 7 minutes of the second half. Two converted frees from Diarmuid O'Connor, the second one in particular being a marvellous score, cut the gap to just a single point and the game was in the melting pot. Mid-way through the half Austin Stacks were reduced to 14 men after their goalkeeper was shown a black card for a deliberate pull down. Despite this it was Stacks who added 2 points without reply to push their lead out to three. 0-12 to 1-6. Jack Barry converted a close-in free to keep Na Gaeil in contention before Diarmuid O'Conner slotted over another free and with 5 minutes remaining there was only a single point between the teams.
